

Sixteen years ago, Dancing Classrooms – St. Louis began as a single pilot program in one classroom. Today, under our new name—Dance Moves STL—we are a vibrant, respected nonprofit arts-education organization serving more than 1,200 students annually in 30 schools across 20+ zip codes. While we remain a proud affiliate of the world-renowned Dancing Classrooms program, our new name reflects our broader vision: to move St. Louis students, schools, and communities forward by creating safe spaces, fostering meaningful connections, and empowering young people through the joyful practice of social dance.

Thanks to your support last year, hundreds of students across the St. Louis region experienced more than just the steps of the Foxtrot or the rhythm of the Rumba. They learned respect, empathy, and the value of working together. They discovered confidence in themselves, connection with their peers, and the power of expressing joy through movement. One of the evening's highlights was our spirited Rumba Dance-Off, featuring Becca Toft, Jessica Schmitt, Heather Lewis, Chris Carenza, and Brian Dunlop—each stepping up with courage, rhythm, and heart to raise funds for a great cause.

MOSHAPE Convention

Dancing Classrooms - St. Louis was honored to partner with the Missouri Alliance for Arts Education to present at the MOSHAPE: Better Together Convention, held November 14–17 at the Lodge of the Four Seasons in Lake of the Ozarks. The event brought together more than 450 Health and Physical Education teachers and professionals from across the state for a weekend of professional development, collaboration, and experiential learning.

Since 2009, Dancing Classrooms - St. Louis has served as a trusted resource for elementary educators—especially PE teachers—by providing high-quality, movement-based learning experiences that meet both national and state learning standards. Our Core Residency Program, designed for upper elementary students, aligns closely with Physical Education standards while

also supporting the development of vital social and emotional skills.

During each residency, students spend approximately 80% of class time engaged in moderate to vigorous physical activity, improving balance, agility, strength, and coordination—all while learning teamwork, respect, and empathy through the joy of partner dance. Our participation in MOSHAPE provided an opportunity to showcase how dance serves as both an art form and a powerful tool for getting students moving, connecting, and growing together. We were thrilled to engage with so many passionate educators and to continue building partnerships that strengthen arts education, physical wellness, and student development across Missouri.




